*Note: This piece is inspired by the famous "Dying Swan" variation, originally created by Mikhail Fokine for prima ballerina Anna Pavlova, which has been performed thousands of times by some of the last century's greatest ballerinas. Normally, this piece is performed as a standalone solo; however, since we are presenting it in the context of a lighthearted children's ballet, we considered it appropriate to re-contextualize it without the somber narrative. While the choreography has changed, we strove to preserve the aesthetic and semi-improvisational nature of the original piece.

"The Firebird"

Music by Igor Stravinsky Choreography by Naomi Hanvey Based on Russian folk tales

Story

Deep in the forests of Russia is an enchanted garden guarded by Koschei the Immortal, a mythical being who cheats death by preserving his soul inside an egg, which he keeps hidden in the garden. If any human trespasses into his territory, Koschei turns them to stone, except for the fair princesses whom he has imprisoned. The only creature his magic cannot touch is the Firebird, who flies in and out of the garden at will to partake of its golden apple tree.

One day, a young prince named Ivan strays into the garden while hunting. Seeing the Firebird, he attempts to capture her as a trophy. The Firebird pleads with him to release her, and when he does, she presents him with one of her own red feathers as a token of friendship. With this feather, she tells him, he may call on her in his time of need. She then cautions him against lingering in the garden and flies off.

Before Ivan has time to heed her warning, he sees the group of captive princesses. Tsarevna, the oldest and most beautiful, befriends him, and they begin to fall in love. Suddenly, they are interrupted by the approach of Koschei. Furious that the stranger has infiltrated his garden, Koschei captures Ivan and prepares to unleash his power against him, despite the princesses' pleas.

Just then, Prince Ivan remembers the red feather and brings it forth. Immediately, the Firebird comes to his aid. Koschei summons monstrous servants for himself, but the Firebird enchants them, forcing them all to dance wildly until they collapse from exhaustion.

Story Cont.

The Firebird spins her magic into a soothing lullaby. In the moments before Koschei awakens, she leads Prince Ivan to the hidden soul-egg. Prince Ivan destroys the egg, killing Koschei, freeing the princesses, and restoring the humanity of the monsters and stone figures in the garden. Prince Ivan reunites with Princess Tsarevna and everyone celebrates their freedom as the Firebird flies over them.
